



(Remember **CULTURE** can be religion, language, food, architecture, dress, customs, social standards, laws, and traditions)
































Buddhist and Hindu temple- shows the spread of these religions from South Asia to Southeast Asia







Important Note:

There is a difference between <u>Cultural Diffusion</u> and <u>Cultural Synthesis</u>

So, what is cultural synthesis?

Cultural Synthesis (Syncretism) is the blending of two or more **cultural** influences that combine elements of both and/or create something entirely new.
